This Level 1/2 qualification is appropriate for learners who are looking to develop significant knowledge and understanding in Health and Social Care and be able to apply their learning to various settings in the Health and social care sector. This qualification is appropriate for learners who are interested in Health and Social care occupations, motivated to complete independent work and challenged by learning through practical and written activities throughout the two-year course. The study of Health and Social care involves understanding the rights and values of individuals who use and work in this industry, identify communication skills and how they can be used for effective communication, describing factors and barriers to communication that help or hinder effective communication, understanding bodily systems and disorders, and learning first aid techniques whilst identifying scenarios that would require medical assistance. Students will engage in both written and practical assessments throughout the two-year course which will allow them to show their understanding of theory and be able to apply it effectively.
