GCSE grading

The GCSE grading system awards pupils within a scale ranging from 9-1.

The **highest** grade which can be achieved is **9**.

Vocational course grading

Pupils studying vocational courses are awarded a Pass, Merit, Distinction or Distinction*.

They are equivalent to the number grades awarded for GCSE courses.

Assessment

- ✓ Most subjects are graded by external exams at the end of Year 11.
- ✓ A number of subjects, including vocational courses, will also have internally marked assessments, which are then externally moderated. A minimum attendance figure of 93% is required for entry to vocational courses.
- ✓ Nearly all subjects will have additional marks for spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG).
- ✓ Specific details of assessment for each subject can be found in the Options area of the school website.

How can I support my child's learning?

- Encourage your child to view homework as a key element to developing and checking the learning completed in school.
- ✓ Use Show My Homework and on-line resources.
- You might also encourage:
 - wider reading around the subjects studied;
 - completing past papers;
 - re-doing work to improve first attempt;
 - making notes on key topics and keeping organised files throughout the 2 years.

How can I support my child's learning?

- Encourage excellent attendance.
- Provide a quiet place where your child can work, avoiding any possible distractions.
- Encourage a good routine, balancing homework, revision, and time for any extra-curricular activity and leisure.
- Help to manage the workload by encouraging your child to meet all deadlines.
- Monitoring homework on Show My Homework.



GCSE Options form - Open Pathway



Please enter your six preferences in the boxes below in rank order from 1 to 6. We will do our utmost to accommodate your preferences, but please note that it will not always be possible to guarantee your top four preferences for various reasons. For this reason, preference numbers 5 and 6 should be subjects which are chosen carefully. Vocational subjects are indicated with an asterisk. Please do not duplicate any answers.

Please note the following restrictions:

- (a) pupils may study a maximum of three vocational qualifications
- (b) GCSE Drama and Performing Arts may not be studied together
- (c) Health & Fitness and Sports Studies may not be studied together.



Making the right subject choices

Consider:

- Choosing subjects that you will enjoy and which your KS3 progress indicates that you are ready for the challenge at KS4.
- ✓ Having a balance of subjects in terms of the skills developed.
- Exploring new subjects carefully, to check that the course content matches what you think it may involve.
- ✓ **Post-16 choices**, remembering that you can often study a subject at post-16 level, even if you have not studied it at GCSE.
