What is Performing Arts?

Performing Arts is the study of all forms of creative activity that are performed in front of an audience, such as drama, music, and dance.

Course Content

Performing Arts allows pupils to gain an in-depth introduction to performance skills, developing their technique through rehearsal and performance; focusing on their chosen art form, a dance piece, play, concert, showcase or pantomime. This performing arts qualification will develop a basic understanding of the values and principles which underpin all work in the performing arts, e.g. being able to work collaboratively with peers and guests from the performing arts sector, team working skills, reflective learning, self-assessment of strengths and weaknesses, self-improvement and development, respect for others, and being able to discuss and comment on the work of others positively.

Pupils will also have the opportunity to either study production processes, covering the essential processes required for staging a performance, including technical and administrative procedures, or they can choose to focus on costume, prop and set design and production skills.
